For example, OK1DOR RST 339, and I'm not sure if the QSO was valid; SP7N was 439 in the first stage, but in the second stage we didn't complete the QSO—the signal dropped to 0 S. OK5NZ 449, OK2PKT 439 in the first stage, OK1USP 599 before the contest, 559 in the second stage.

OK2PYA and OK1DSZ, who were always 599+ here, today 569 and 579. How is that possible??? Strongest were OK1BM and OK1OA at 599+, but they're only about 20 km away

as the crow flies. And OK1FII and DK2FG at 599. I was happy to make a contest QSO with Standa OK2SG after such a long time.
